

Romanian seacoast

The Black Sea's Romanian seacoast has a complex formation, offering an important touristic value. It has a total length of 244 km. The Danube Delta and the Razim-Sulina lagoon complex represent the northern side. Towards the south is the actual seacoast stretching on a length of about 70 km. The large sunny beaches (9-12 hours of sun per day), with fine sand, sweet and salt water lakes, therapeutic mud, mineral springs and high sea walls.

The well known spas at Mamaia, Eforie Nord, Eforie Sud, Techirghiol, Costinesti, Neptun, Jupiter, Aurora, Saturn and Mangalia, with a large number of accommodation places and great treatment facilities give the tourists great reasons to come here to cure and relax.

The Black Sea is considered to be the first touristic area of Romania, representing an important national richness with its great therapeutic qualities and its archaeological treasures.

The total accommodation capabilities now exceed 140000 places , the total number of tourists coming here everyyear summing up to 2 millions.
